NOTES ON USAGE AND STYLE

DÎVÂN: Journal of Interdisciplinary Studies publishes articles for a broad readership. Articles submitted to the journal may deal with subjects that require technical expertise, but authors should keep in mind that readers from different fields, even educated ones, may not be familiar with such subjects in any great detail. Authors should thus address their arguments to an audience of general, educated readers and arrange their articles accordingly. Some points that deserve special attention are as follows:

- Authors should clearly state the thesis, motivation, contribution, and significance of the article.
- Authors should not forget that the target audience is the general, educated reader, and should not assume that all readers will, can, or need to understand fine points familiar only to experts in a field. Authors should clearly state all the information and ideas necessary to understanding the thesis of the article.
- Authors should discuss and identify the key terms coined or used in the article.
 Authors should not expect readers to know them already or to consult other sources to learn about them.
- The language of the articles should follow the conventions of academic writing and style. The language of consulted historical and technical sources should not dominate the article; in cases where the use of obscure terms or passages is unavoidable, authors should make an effort to present them in a meaningful way.

PARTS AND FORMATTING

- Submissions must include:
 - o An article of 6000–1000 words
 - o An abstract of 150–250 words and its Turkish translation
 - o Five to ten keywords and their Turkish translation
 - A bibliography
- The font used throughout the article must be Times New Roman
- The title of the article must be written in bold, uppercase, size-14 font
- Section headings must be written in bold, uppercase, size-12 font

- Subheadings must be written in bold, title case, size-12 font
- The main text of the article must be written in size-12 font
- The margins on all sides (including footnotes) must be 2.54 cm (1 inch)

TRANSLITERATION

For the transliteration of Arabic, Persian, and Ottoman-Turkish words, we ask our authors to adhere to the transliteration table and conventions of the *International Journal of Middle East Studies*:
